So I have two "did not votes" on my record. Both times had to do with not living near my assigned polling place. In 2008, I had moved from Hollywood to San Bernardino. I didn't have a car. "You don't like what I've given you? I can give more! How about Bozo the Clown, Pennywise, and the Joker? If that's still not enough, I can add a little Ronald McDonald!" Diabolical laughter ensues.

"No! No! No! You're messing it up! You've got to fix this thing!" The rumbling continues.

And when Dr D David David Schultz smacked John Stossel during a 1984 20/20 interview, it sure looked real. Owen Hart's death in the ring was real after he plummeted eight stories in 1999.

Eddie Guerrero had a heart attack during a wrestling match in 2005. The script doesn't always hold. Shit gets real.

For all practical reasons, we can say the 2000 Election was scripted. There were players involved. There was a certain way the story was supposed to go. Have you heard of interactive murder/ mystery plays where actors involve the audience through impromptu dialogue? I first heard about this on cruise ships, but it's also the main storyline in The Man Who Knew Too Little. The 2000 Election involved people.
